LOCAL IMPACT

In celebration of *PBS* Wisconsin's 70th anniversary, we proudly reflect on our longstanding mission to be Wisconsin's most trusted source of quality, accessible content. For seven decades, PBS Wisconsin has enriched, educated, and entertained diverse audiences across the state through impactful storytelling and

programming. In 2024, we connected with more than 1.3 million monthly broadcast viewers, with an additional 966,000 monthly video streams across our digital platforms. Our PBS KIDS[®] programming reached new milestones, with an impressive 4.1 million views per month on average across all platforms. From



digital content to classroom education services and community engagement initiatives, PBS Wisconsin continues to deepen its connection with audiences across the state as we celebrate this milestone year.

EDUCATION

PBS Wisconsin Education partners with educators by providing high-quality classroom resources and professional learning opportunities. We produce free, standards-aligned, Wisconsin-focused educational media that enhances learning. In 2024, more than 5,000 Wisconsin educators engaged in professional learning through PBS Wisconsin Education, while our Wisconsinfocused media content was accessed in more than 667,000 online sessions by Wisconsin educators, learners, and families. At the 2024 Public Media Awards, PBS Wisconsin Education was honored with the prestigious Overall Excellence in Education Award.

The Look Back

The Look Back is a new collection from PBS Wisconsin Education that explores artifacts and their context to learn about different eras from Wisconsin's history. Made for learners in grades 4-6 – and anyone who loves history – the collection is hosted by five Wisconsin historians who share the artifacts, ask questions, visit local archives and history museums to connect each object to Wisconsin history, and tell the story of what they've discovered. Viewers learn about time periods from across Wisconsin history, beginning before Wisconsin's statehood with Ho-Chunk dugout canoes and traveling to the modern day with Trek bicycles.

The collection is the first **PBS** Wisconsin Education production with a dedicated studio set and hosts. Like all of PBS Wisconsin Education's materials, the series is available for free to educators of all types in Wisconsin.


Wisconsin **Biographies**

PBS Wisconsin Education added a new animated story to our <u>Wisconsin Biographies</u> collection, Roberto Hernández: Working for La Comunidad. Wisconsin Biographies is a collection of free, educational, online resources to enrich social studies and English language arts curriculum in grades 3-6. Hernández's story

PBS Wisconsin Education worked with Milwaukeebased Latina artist, Quinn Blackshere, to animate Hernández's story, which also features narration and a digital book in both English and Spanish. The production team consulted and collaborated with a



cohort of educators from across the state, members of Hernández's family, and his fellow activists to help shape the story.

Re/sound

In collaboration with Wisconsin School Music Association, PBS Wisconsin Education expanded our Re/sound: Songs of Wisconsin

classroom media collection to include the Mariachi Monarcas de Milwaukee. Re/sound: Songs of Wisconsin is a multimedia resource designed to help general music educators and learners in grades 4-8 explore the connections between music, culture, and emotion.



5,000 Educators engaged in professional learning

The Mariachi Monarcas is a student-led mariachi band from Milwaukee that shares and celebrates traditional Mexican music in their Wisconsin community and beyond.

PBS KIDS Library and Community Learning Cohort In 2024, PBS Wisconsin

empowered 34 Wisconsin library staff members with innovative strategies for integrating playful learning and meaningful media from

Education Engagement team continues to expand its reach, connecting with more than 5,000 educators through professional learning and supporting educators in using PBS resources in learning spaces across Wisconsin. Classroom teachers, outof-school-time educators, childhood professionals met with our team, participated in hands-on training, and explored ways to utilize PBS educational media to deepen

PBS KIDS into community programs. Since its inception in 2021, the program has engaged 94 librarians from every library system in the state, reaching more than 2,000 children and 1,000 caregivers with educationally enriching PBS-connected initiatives.

Media Literacy Cohort

This program has also been pivotal in advancing media literacy among educators in the state. This year's cohort brought together 21 Wisconsin educators to pursue eight media literacy micro-credentials, including hands-on training in video and audio production to enhance student mediamaking. Since its beginning in 2020, 97 Wisconsin educators have participated, making Wisconsin the second-highest in the nation for PBS Media Literacy Certified Educators.



STORYTELLING

PBS Wisconsin has a strong and substantial tradition of producing content for broadcast and streaming that celebrates the stories of people from every corner of Wisconsin. From breathtaking musical performances such as Wisconsin Young Artists Compete: The Final *Forte 2024*, to thought-provoking digital series like Why Race Matters, PBS Wisconsin shares responsive local programming that serves diverse communities.

Wisconsin Hometown Stories: Beloit

PBS Wisconsin proudly delivered the 14th installment of our Wisconsin Hometown Stories series, focused on Beloit. A partnership with the Wisconsin Historical Society, this ambitious television series tells Wisconsin stories. one community at a time, bringing the history of those places to life for a statewide audience.

As a companion to the television program, PBS Wisconsin Education partnered with the Beloit Memorial High School Latino Studies class for

Wisconsin Hometown Stories: Youth Media, a project that co-produced four short documentaries connecting national issues to local experiences. School district staff, students, families, and PBS Wisconsin staff viewed the short documentaries during the Beloit International Film Festival, where students discussed their topic choices and experiences making media.

Before the premiere broadcast of Wisconsin Hometown Stories: Beloit, PBS Wisconsin hosted a free preview screening where more than 350 community

Wisconsin Life

Wisconsin

PBS Wisconsin's awardwinning <u>Wisconsin Life</u> series returned for its 11th season. Hosted by Angela Fitzgerald, Wisconsin Life celebrates what makes Wisconsin unique through the diverse stories of its people and places. Our producers travel the state in search of stories that are humorous, surprising, emotional, and thoughtprovoking. All of the stories are rich with the personality of the state we call home.

In 2024, a Wisconsin *Life* segment, "Jack the Magnificent," about a beloved miniature horse from Eau Claire, won a prestigious national Edward R. Murrow Award from the Radio **Television Digital News** Association.

Lighthouses PBS Wisconsin produced

Wisconsin Lighthouses, a one-hour documentary that illuminates the power and appeal of the iconic structures by exploring their history, idyllic settings, unique architecture, the people who tended to these lifesaving buildings and called them home, and the light they still shine on a bygone era.

We welcomed more than 250 community members for a free preview screening of Wisconsin Lighthouses in Manitowoc. Following the film, guests enjoyed a panel discussion with experts to learn more about the innovative ways people in Wisconsin are telling our state's rich lighthouse history.

Guests of the screening were also the first to experience the film's interactive

complement, Wisconsin Lighthouses: Illuminating Cana Island. This 3D feature on *pbswisconsin.org* allows digital "visitors" to explore the Cana Island Lighthouse both inside and out. As part of this project, PBS Wisconsin worked with students in the University of Wisconsin-Madison Computer, Data & Information Sciences School on a capstone project exploring how to make a 3D lighthouse experience accessible to everyone.

EVENTS & ENGAGEMENT

PBS Wisconsin engages in the community to ensure those we serve feel represented, valued, and connected through our work. In 2024, PBS Wisconsin criss-crossed the state and hosted 20 in-person events in nine cities with more than 2,000 total attendees. We also hosted two expo-style events with 31,200 total guests in attendance. This work connected communities, amplified local voices, and opened the doors to crucial public conversations.

Garden & Landscape Expo

PBS Wisconsin's <u>Garden &</u> Landscape Expo is a threeday event celebrating the latest trends in gardening, landscaping, local foods, and ecological sustainability. Marking its 32nd year in 2024, the event offered free educational presentations, an exhibitor mall, University of Wisconsin-Madison Extension Horticulture experts, a floral design competition, and more.

The expo had nearly 15,000 attendees, 115 educational seminars, 35 stage demonstrations, 250 vendor booths representing 160 businesses and organizations, and more than 260 community volunteers.

A newly-rebranded PBS KIDS Backyard debuted at the event with educational activities for kids and appearances by Daniel Tiger and Clifford the Big Red Dog. PBS Wisconsin engineering staff also led tours of the PBS Wisconsin production truck, introducing guests to the magic of remote television



production. With a stationwide goal of increasing accessibility in our programs and events, we offered simultaneous American Sign Language interpretation for several presentations each day of the event, and a virtual truck tour was also available via QR code and streaming video.



The Great Wisconsin Quilt Show

The 20th-annual Great Wisconsin Quilt Show

was again one of the largest quilting events in the country, with 16,200 attendees, more than 600 quilts on display, 188 educational classes, 350 vendor booths, and 456 community volunteers. The event's annual community service project, Quilt to Give, again had an enthusiastic response.

Attendees donated and created more than 100 quilts that were included with care packages that PBS Wisconsin Education distributed to refugee children resettling across the state.

The show featured 13 additional special quilt exhibits, including the work of Bonnie LeBeaux, a Lakota and Diné creator of authentic Native American Star Quilts. Another exhibit from Black Threads featured the work of six local artists, including

Our in-depth news programs and innovative documentary investigations have established PBS Wisconsin as a trusted source of quality reporting and information. In addition to comprehensive news coverage that provides a forum for the lively. civil, and meaningful exchange of ideas on issues affecting the people of Wisconsin, PBS Wisconsin also produces complete coverage of state events, including governor's and other legislative addresses, election debates, and special programs that provide access to the candidates running for office in Wisconsin.

In a year of elections, PBS Wisconsin's news and public affairs coverage ensured that Wisconsinites had access to key information about candidates for state and national offices. PBS Wisconsin reporters traveled to the 2024 Republican and Democratic Conventions in Milwaukee and Chicago, offering analysis and commentary that appeared nationally on PBS News *Hour* and locally on *Here* & *Now,* our flagship weekly news program. Daily comprehensive and trusted election news coverage was also reported on Wisconsin Vote.



Revenue

In Fiscal Year 2024 (July 1, 2023-June 30, 2024), PBS Wisconsin reported strong financial outcomes stemming from the generosity of our donors, corporations, and foundations, reinforced by essential grants from the Corporation for Public Broadcasting and careful stewardship.

These results not only enabled PBS Wisconsin to sustain its commitment to creating meaningful content for Wisconsin, but they also empowered us to extend our educational reach, increase engagement, and create more critically acclaimed and community-focused productions.

Expenses

Seventy percent of every dollar PBS Wisconsin raises directly supports television and digital programming, broadcast, and vital educational and community outreach services across the state. The remaining portion of our operating expenses goes toward developing and stewarding donor contributions and general operations in support of PBS Wisconsin's statewide reach and impact, ensuring our continued service to audiences now and in the future. This balanced approach allows PBS Wisconsin to meet current operational needs while also investing in the future.


